Weir Creek hounds were trained on both hare and cottontail, and they were exceptionally hard workers in the field. The Weir Creek Kennel was owned by Jack Stutz who was a comrade and associate of Clarence Jones who had the Fish Creek hounds in New York. When asked to describe Weir Creek hounds, adaptability and determination were the two most used words to describe them. Weir Creeks had the ability to adapt and were able to adjust quickly to changes in scenting conditions and were able to work harmoniously with a variety of running mates. A Weir Creek hound would pursue a rabbit as fast as conditions permitted or as slowly as conditions demanded. At a loss, it will first work close, and then, if necessary, move out gradually to recover the line. The hounds would search independently of each other, in a productive manner, with sufficient range. Range within control distance of the hunter and be obedient to his commands, yet head strong and determined to do whatever it takes to produce a rabbit under any condition or circumstance with non-stop pursuance. Determination is that quality which causes a hound to succeed against severe odds. A determined hound has a purpose in mind and will overcome, through sheer perseverance, many obstacles that often frustrate less determined running mates. Determination keeps a hound at its work as long as there is a possibility of achievement and quite often long after its body has passed the peak of its endurance. Determination is desire in its most intense form, which described Weir Creek Beagles. Mario Santoro {Clarence "Fish Creek" Jones' handler} stated; ***“the Weir Creek hounds were very dependable in the field and they always accounted for their rabbit, no matter what the weather or scenting conditions were like. They would drive when they could, but would also work a hard check very carefully to keep the run going”.***

The first notable hound with the name Weir Creek was a bitch named Weir Creek Sue. She was sired by FC Travelon Autumn Frost and was out of a FC Travelon Autumn Frost bitch. Sue in turn was bred to FC Fish Creek Little Red to produce a bitch named Weir Creek Trudy. Then to keep the pattern of line-breeding a bitch back to her own sire, Jack Stutz bred Trudy back to her own sire. Two “notable” hounds were produced from this cross; FC Fish Creek Whistler and the male that would be the backbone of Weir Creek Kennels, FC Weir Creek Ruff.

Mr. W.P. Land of Memphis, TN also desired to tap into this style and type of hound. While active in the Field Trial circuit Mr. Land made a reputation for himself as a man that “called it like it was”, not holding back or having any restraints. He also ran his dogs religiously spending the majority of all his spare time in the field with his dogs. He also had the “knack”, or the non-biased natural ability to see dogs for what they were, the positive and negative. Mr. Land had a partner named Mr. Bohn of the Bohnland Kennels. They somewhat “joined forces” and formed an alliance. Mr. Bohn provided the finances and Mr. Land did the work of training, breeding and raising the hounds. Eventually, Jack Stutz of the Weir Creek Kennel contacted W.P. Land, visited Mr. Land and ran hounds with him. While he was there he was impressed with the hound work he saw. Mr. Land also decided that the Weir Creeks had something to offer him in his own breeding program, so Jack Stutz and W.P. Land formed their own alliance. After his visit, Jack Stutz sent Weir Creek Ruff to Mr. Land. Ruff, who was started, running but not yet seasoned, was put through Mr.

Land’s grueling training program and under the microscope of Land’s “eye for talent”. Mr. Land right away saw raw ability and after a while with Mr. Land Ruff began to win at trials and earned his championship. Eventually Mr. Land bred his best bitch, “Bohnland Jenks” to FC Weir Creek Ruff. This cross of Ruff and Jenks produced a hound named FC Weir Creek Buzz, who would be the driving force behind Weir Creek Kennels and the foundation of several new lines. Let’s look at **FC Weir Creek Buzz’s Pedigree:**

Both sides of the pedigree trace back to the same "roots" namely Yellow Creek Sport. The Yellow Creek line was responsible for the foundation and creation of many lines. However, the Yellow Creek line branched off in different directions and the unrelated outcrosses determined which line was the foundation for any particular line that evolved into the different styles of gun dog brace, large pack hare or anything in-between. The three main dogs, all being out of Yellow Creek Sport; FC Yellow Creek Ben, FC Sammy R and FC Sutton’s Sport provided different branches from the same Yellow Creek tree for many lines to evolve from. Just to mention a few in no particular order; Concord, Argo, Grays Linesman, Pearson Creek, Wilcliffe, Black River, Fish Creek, Warfield, Weir Creek, Black Creek, Little Ireland, Skull Fork, Gay Baker, Dingus Macrae and I could go on and on, fast dogs, slow dogs, medium speed dogs etc... all are loaded with Yellow Creek blood if you go back far enough, yet each with different unrelated outcrosses which determined the different directions of the styles and characteristics of each of these lines would evolve into. The particular Yellow Creek lines that influenced the evolution of Weir Creek Beagles were 22 crosses of Gray’s Linesman via FC Sutton’s Sport and 12 crosses of FC Sammy R. Also 4 crosses Concord Spot and a cross of Wilclffe Boogie compliments of FC Yellow Creek Ben. Weir Creek derived from solid Yellow Creek, and it was from what most gun hunters will arguably say was the “best” that Yellow Creek had to offer, taking the “unrelated crosses” into consideration.

Though it is interesting to see how FC Weir Creek Buzz and the Weir Creek line evolved, it is astonishing and helpful to know the lines that Weir Creek helped to establish. When you do a “reverse pedigree” on Buzz, you clearly can see his contribution to many kennels and lines. **{A “pedigree” displays the dogs leading up to Buzz. A “reverse pedigree” displays the dogs deriving from Buzz.}** Let’s take a look at some of the “main” contributions that FC Weir Creek Buzz has bestowed upon us.

The direct pups of Buzz were responsible for establishing the foundation for some “well known” lines, let’s look at a few they produced:

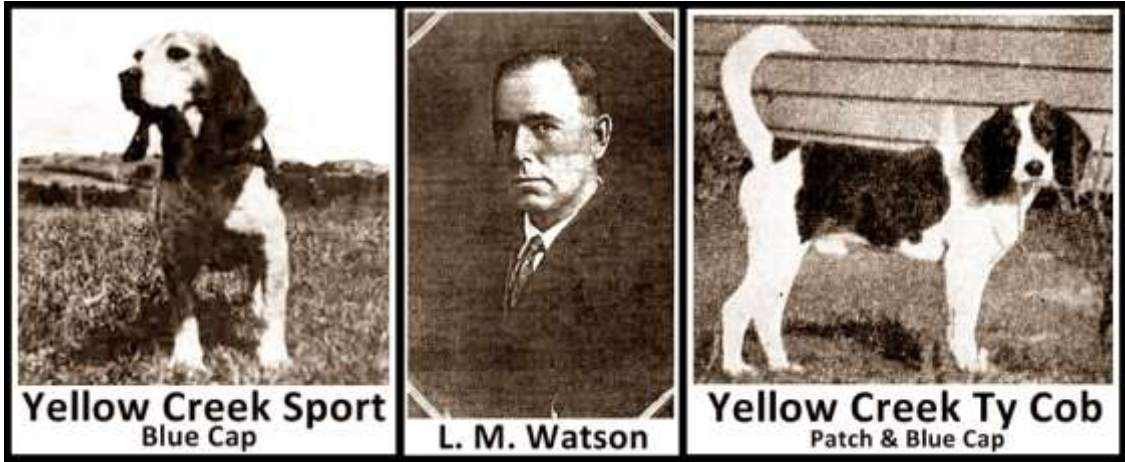

W.P. Land described FC Weir Creek Buzz as follows: ***"Now as to Buzz. He was one of the greatest hounds I ever bred or owned, and he lived to a ripe old age of fourteen before he passed away. He was a great searcher, and he could move his game well and hold his line well. We gunned him regularly until he was ten years of age, and he would still go well, but was getting too slow for the pack and would get behind on all day hunts. His dam, Jenks, was a good one, but had too much fire for trials as they were. She and Sinbad came out of a litter of eight, and in that litter there were three field champions and two others that only needed one win to finish. They were all great rabbit hounds...Buzz was a good looking hound, I with good features such as straight legs, good body conformation and lovely ears. He had a heavy, short bawl voice that was used very freely, but very correctly, and a nose second to none. He was a great hound any way you look at him. He was a red hound or a dark chocolate color. Very pretty...he looked a lot like Ruff except he had a fuller blanket and was red while Ruff was black, white and tan."***

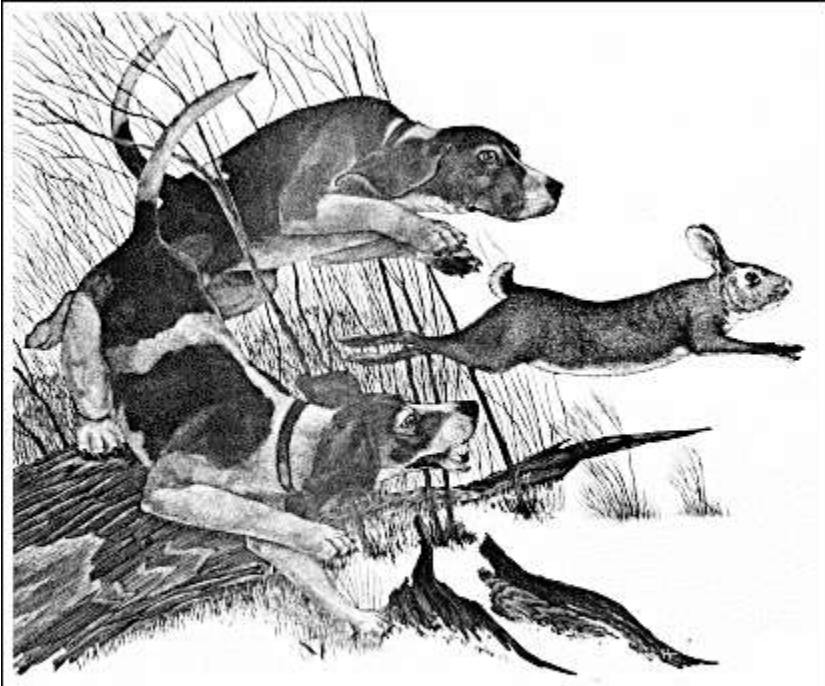
